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

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

#### **VICE - CHANCELLOR'S MESSAGE**





I am delightful to release the 2017-18 Annual Report of the Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) which is progressively growing by leaps and bounds in the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) scenario in India. Open Universities in India have been making substantial, massive contributions to the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Higher Education. The State of Tamil Nadu is leading in the GER of the Country, adding to this in which TNOU is contributing to increase the GER by catering to the disadvantaged groups particularly the dropouts, housewives, the differently-abled, the destitute, the deprived and the socially weaker sections of the society. The TNOU has thus, emerged as a People's University.

The Programmes on offer at the University have been recognized by such regulatory bodies as the University Grants Commission (UGC), the Distance Education Bureau (DEB), the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI). The University has launched the Research Programmes as well through Regular mode with the approval of UGC and the State Government of Tamil Nadu.

Besides, obtaining the 12B Status of the UGC, the University has established robust linkages with the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA), a subsidiary of the Commonwealth of Learning (COL), Vancouver, Canada, Asian Association of Open Universities (AAOU), International Council for Open and Distance Education (ICDE), Norway, as well as other leading organizations in the area of Open and Distance Learning (ODL). In collaboration with the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, the TNOU has introduced several skill based agricultural Programmes. The University as of March, 2018 offers 211 UGC-approved Programmes through 13 Schools of Study. The University has a state-of-the-art Electronic Media Production and Research Centre (EMPRC) which is involved in the preparation of Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) through the Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) platform of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India.

I am happy to inform that under the aegis of the Government of Tamil Nadu, the TNOU in collaboration with Anna University has created a Networked Digital Library connecting all the 13 Universities in the State of Tamil Nadu. The Network Digital Library was opened by the Honorable Chief Minister of

Tamil Nadu.

It gives me immense pleasure to mention that the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has graciously sanctioned fund for the constructions of TNOU Regional Centre building at Nilgiris and Villupuram.

During 2017-18, the University hosted a number of seminars, conferences, workshops and training Programmes involving eminent experts in the field concerned for the benefit of the students, academics and other stakeholders of the University. The faculties of the University have contributed research articles in the reputed journals and presented research papers in the Conferences held across the Country and abroad.

The University conducted the 10th Convocation on 28th November, 2017 with great success in which Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu was the Chief Guest and granted formal recognition to 16,879 learners who had successfully earned degrees, diplomas and certificates at TNOU.

The current reporting year witnessed serious efforts being made to streamlining some of our academic operations including admissions, student support services, delivery of study materials and students placement. A Task Force has been constituted to take corrective measures enabling effective delivery of study materials to the students

TNOU conducted Term-End Examination June-2017 and December-2017 successfully without any complaint in 64 Exam Centres which included 9 Jail Centres.

The admission for January-2018 session was unique by introducing on line admission system as part of automation and as per the initiatives of Digital India Campaign. New Strategies were evolved for enhancing enrolment in January-2018 session. These included formation of Admission Monitoring Committee; regular video conferencing with Regional Coordinators; Reaching out to secondary/senior secondary School pass outs in all districts; Reaching out through Self help group Network; Reaching out through NGO Networks in the State; Preparing banners/hoardings/leaflets/handouts in English/ Tamil languages; and Publicity through SMS/email/social networking media. All these pro-active efforts helped us in achieving a growth in learner enrolment during the reported period.

On this occasion, I whole heartedly congratulate each and every staff of the University and particularly the Committee involved in bringing out this Annual Report of TNOU for the Year 2017-2018.

### Introduction

The Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) was established by an Act (Act No.27) of the Legislative Assembly of the Government of Tamil Nadu in 2002. As per this Act the University with its headquarters at Chennai may carry out its academic activities in any State/Union Territory of the Indian Union as well as in any Country.

#### The objectives of the University are -

- a) To strengthen and diversify the degree, diploma and certificate courses related to the needs of employment and necessary for the economy of the State and the Country.
- b) To provide access to higher education for large segments of population and in particular, the disadvantaged groups such as those living in remote and rural areas including working people, housewives and other adults who wish to upgrade or acquire knowledge through studies in various fields.
- c) To promote acquisition of knowledge and to continually offer opportunities for upgrading knowledge, training and skills in the context of innovations, research and discovery in all fields of human endeavours.
- d) To evolve flexible and robust curricula to widen educational access, deepen knowledge frontier and create entrepreneurial skill sets.
- e) To provide a non-formal channel of educational system complementary to the formal system and encourage transfer of credits
- f) To provide education and training in the various arts and crafts and
- g) To provide for training of teachers

#### Journey of Tamil Nadu Open University

The Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) was established in the year 2002 by the Government of Tamil Nadu for the introduction and promotion of Open Learning and Distance Education systems in the educational pattern of the State and for the co-ordination and determination of standards in such systems. Since its inception, the University has been providing cost-effective, socially-relevant Open and Distance Learning (ODL) to the hitherto unreached as well as the disadvantaged groups such as those living in remote and rural areas including the working people, housewives, physically handicapped and SC/ST students. The growth of the University during the past 15 years has been phenomenal. At present, with a cumulative student strength of above 10,82,656 in 211 Programmes of study across various disciplines and skills at different levels from Certificate to Post Graduate that are imparted through 13 Academic Schools, 5 Support Divisions, 1 Media Centre and a robust network

of 484 Learner Support and Service Centres across the State. It admits the students throughout the year under two admission cycles, viz., Calendar Year (January – June) and Academic Year (July – December).

The Tamil Nadu Open University is the first University in the State to have introduced the credit based Self-Learning Materials (SLM) in print as early as 2003. While the round-the-year admission policy with examination schedules conveniently arranged on week–ends and the effective continuous assessment provision have sufficiently addressed the issue of quantity in the form of increasing higher education access, the University has been harnessing the advancements in ICT to continuously improve quality. The University has digitalized its learner support systems including admission, examination, material distribution, academic counselling, etc. With the sanctioned teaching staff strength of 75 and non-teaching staff strength of 59, the University has been ably addressing the learning needs of all the students. The University is one of the 5, among the 15 Open Universities in the Country, to have been accorded with 12B status of the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi. It is also one of the very few Universities in the State to have received approval of the UGC for offering all its academic Programmes through the distance mode.



# Chapter-4 TNOU Schools of Study

#### **Schools of Study**

At present, there are 13 Schools of Study, which are responsible for planning, designing, developing and coordinating academic programmes and courses offered by it. Each School of Study has a Board of Studies that oversees the academic activities of the School, such as curriculum development, research and other major activities of the School. The details of academic programmes, eligibility criteria, duration, credit requirements and medium of instruction are available on TNOU's website www.tnou.ac.in. #### **Academic Programmes of TNOU**

TNOU is offering 211 Academic Programmes which includes Professional, Skill Development and Awareness related. The level of TNOU Academic Programmes starts with Preparatory, Certificate, Diploma, Post Graduate Diploma, Vocational Diploma, Bachelor Degree, Master Degree and Research Programmes. All the TNOU Academic Programmes are offered through its School of Studies. TNOU also plans to introduce various new Academic Programmes including Skill related Vocational Programmes for immediate employment in the relevant industries.

All the TNOU Academic Programmes have been developed by the faculties in consultation with eminent experts in the country and also involving industries in Curriculum design and development of course materials according to the industries need particularly for Skill Development Programmes. TNOU provides high quality learning material in Self Instructional Mode (SIM) Format to its learners and maintain the high standard in providing higher education through distance mode in the State of Tamil Nadu.

A new initiative called Flexible Skill Training has been introduced to offer Skill Oriented Training Programmes to the rural and disadvantaged groups in Tamil Nadu through Community Colleges and all Schools of Study are working to offer more and more Skill Training Programmes.

All the TNOU Academic programmes have been assigned credit weightage. In Open and Distance Learning One Credit is equal to 30 hours of study. Accordingly the following minimum credits are assigned for TNOU Academic programmes.

- 1. Certificate level Programme with the duration of six months 16 Credits
- 2. Diploma level Programme with the duration of one year 32 Credits
- 3. Degree level Programme with the duration of three years 96 Credits
- 4. Master Degree level Programme with the duration of two years 64 Credits

Credit Transfer and Credit exemption are also given to TNOU learners to complete the programme and obtain a degree without repeating the Courses already studied and cleared.

TNOU also offers Research Programmes such as Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) through Regular and Part Time mode in 19 subjects. TNOU has aligned its Skill Training related Vocational Diploma programme Curriculum that are offered through Community Colleges in Tamil Nadu.

For the school dropouts, the school non-starter and the school failures TNOU has developed Preparatory Programmes by giving credit weightage which help the above category of people to enter in to main stream of education and obtain higher education.

Chapter - 6 TNOU Divisions

### 1. Administration Division [AD]

The general administration of the University is run by Administration Division headed by the Registrar of the University. It provides administrative support to all the Schools, Divisions, Centres and other Units of the University.

The day to day administration of the University is looked after by the Administration Division in conjunction with other functional and Operational Divisions. This Division provides support to all functional and Operational Divisions, Centres, Units, Schools of Studies and Regional Centres by providing logistic and administrative support to facilitate both academic and non-academic activities. To carry out its various functions, the Administration Division is divided into Sections on the basis of the nature of its duties and responsibilities. The security and safety of the University property at the University Headquarters is managed by the Administration Division.

The organisation of the meetings of the Syndicate is dealt by the Administration Division. It also deals with the amendment, addition and deletion in the Acts and Statutes of the University; the Ordinance and Regulations framed under the Act and ensures their compliance. The Administration Division gives inputs to other Sections/Divisions /Centres/ Units/Cells/Schools by providing the key papers/minutes/ decisions etc., to facilitate their work particularly in policy matters. Major activities coordinated by the Administration Division in the period of the report include Meetings of the Syndicate, Meeting of the Purchase Committee and Meetings of the Establishment Committee. The Purchase Committee are Standing Committees of the Syndicate. Further, it also coordinated sending answers to Tamil Nadu State Assembly Questions that were replied in the period of this report.

### (i) Establishment

The service matters of all Academic and Non-academic employees of the University are looked after by the Establishment Section. Table 6.1. reflects the strength of Academic Staff which is 75.

### ii). Recruitment

### iii). Right to Information

The University is prompt in providing timely information asked under the RTI Act. There is a separate Cell for this purpose. The Right to Information Cell meticulously replies to the queries raised under Right to Information (RTI) Act 2005. The University designated Public Information Officers (PIOs) and Appellate Authorities at Headquarters for strict compliance of RTI Act and for providing timely reply of queries. The University responded to 64 queries received under the RTI Act, 2005 during the period of the report.

### iv). Purchase Unit

The Purchase Unit of Administration Division manages the tasks of purchase of items for the University. It is also responsible for the insurance of the assets and properties of the University as well as the maintenance of all the equipments/machines, procured by this Unit.

### v). Legal Matters

The Administration takes care of all legal matters related to the University, including pending cases before the various courts located at chennai The Administration also deals with the various vetting of legal documents referred to it by the University.

### vi). Committees against Sexual Harassment

The University has adopted the policy and rules and regulations for prevention of sexual harassment against women employees and students. The University has constituted a Committee at headquarters as per norms.

### vii). Service matters of Teachers

The University has a separate Section namely the Establishment Section, which deals with the service matters of teachers . It also coordinates all the administrative and academic activities pertaining to the



recruitment, career advancement scheme, travel grants, study/ sabbatical leave, conduct of meetings of Academic Council. The Establishment Section deals with service matters of teachers at the Headquarters and at the Regional Centres. It convened meetings of the Academic Council during the period of the report.

### viii). Construction and Maintenance Activities

The construction and maintenance activities of the University are undertaken by the Estate Office which is responsible for the maintenance of the University which includes Administrative Building, Academic Blocks, MPPD Block and the Regional Centres. The maintenance activities include supply of water, electricity, air-conditioning system, maintenance of lights, pump houses and bore wells throughout the University Campus.

### ix). Planning and Development

The Planning and Development Division is responsible for the overall planning and monitoring of the University. This Division has the following objectives:


- To set the vision and directions for the University's Open and Distance Learning System;

### 2. Finance Division [FD]



### 3. Student Registration & Evaluation Division [SR&ED]

SR&ED is responsible for monitoring registration of students for different programmes offered by the University. This division play important role in admission process by releasing the admission notice and circulating the schedule of operation to all . Other important activities of the division are finalizing re- admission data and sending the same to Student Evaluation (Admission) for incorporation in their records. This division also maintains the data base of the students' records. After initiation of online admission process student's registration and registration data are confirmed by Automation established at the TNOU.

SR&ED is mainly responsible for evaluation of learner performance in Term-End Examinations. It ecoerdinates the activities pertaining to continuous evaluation and evaluation of Project Reports. It is

Also mandated for Certification of learners by conferring degrees/diplomas/certificates. The Division also maintains the database of all active students on rolls of the University.

### 4. Material Production and Distribution Division [MPDD]

The MP&DD is engaged with core activities of Self Learning Materials printing and Distributing to the students. The primary "Motto" of MPDD is make the Self Learning Materials reach the students well in advance of the commencement of the Examination and have taken all possible initiatives digitally through the Automation / On line system which is effectively implemented at MPDD.

The Main Objective of MPDD is to ascertain the timely despatch of study materials to the students. The **Vision and Mission** of MPDD is to reach the masses and the Students Community at the remote area by delivering quality services at economical and cheaper cost so as to enable the poor to educate themselves to raise their standard of living. Keeping this in mind, MPDD has initiated a proposal to convert Self Learning Materials (hard copy) into CDs/e-contents (Soft Copy) thereby making the Study Materials easily accessible and downloadable. Implementation of this project will result in drastic reduction in printing cost, incomparable quality in delivery system with other conventional Universities by means of uploading the Study Materials by giving unique ID and username for enrolled Students. CD's have been prepared and kept ready for uploading the same in the TNOU Website for the students.

- Automation / Online system is implemented, thus fulfilling the vision as given above. Through Automation, almost every activities, of MPDD is now digitalized, for instance the stock updation, Printing of Study Materials, Despatch process etc., which paved the way for the timely delivery of study materials and thereby sustain standard and quality of dispatch.
- Various dispatch strategies are being adopted for the purpose of economy, timely deliverance and effective manpower utilization. Nearly 2,50,000 Self Learning Materials have been printed. Around 1,00,000 Self Learning Materials have been despatched. Special Admission Camps are being conducted at various places / Institutions / Social Work Group centres etc. to create awareness among the economically weaker sections of the Society and thereby enhancing the Students enrolment. Around 400 students have been admitted in the Special Admission Camp (list encl.).
- Due to Automation, students can view the dispatch status of Self Learning Materials.
- Proper planning of Printing of Study Materials was made and accordingly printing work is arranged through proper channel. Primary advantage in Printing the Study Materials at a stretch are:-
  - (i) To avoid delay of books reaching the Students drastically.
  - (ii) To reduce the Printing cost.

In order to maintain the quality and the standard and the quality the Printed Study Materials includes the following special features:-

- (i) Bar coding.
- (ii) Soft Binding
- (iii) Standardized and high resolutions multi-colour Printing of Wrapper.
- (iv) Easily Readable Text for which is self-explanatory and instructional.

- Proper work Allocation to the Staff Members of MPDD and thus the smooth functioning of work sustained.
- For all the Course Titles, CD's in the PDF format have been prepared. The main purpose of CD preparation is to dilute the traditional method of using negatives/films for Printing and to move towards digital Printing.

### Activities of MPDD

- Based on the stock availability and the trend in Admissions and previous year's admission strengths, the respective schools shall place their requirements for printing to MPDD with approval of Authorities.
- Printing work is equally distributed among the three Co-operative Societies i.e. M/s. Virudhunagar Co-op. Press, M/s. Ramanathapuram Co-op. Press and M/s. Kancheepuram Co-op. Press, so as to receive the same within the stipulated time.
- Stock entries are made both digitally and in the Stock Register for reconciliation purpose.
- Physical verification of Stocks.
- Due to the effective implementation of Automation at MPDD, efforts are taken to dispatch the study materials to the students on the same day / or the next day of the admission along with the ID cards. Thus, the economy maintained by cut down the cost of ID cards dispatch.
- Photocopies of Study Materials are being taken for less enrolled Programmes to reduce the Printing cost.
- Printing and despatch of application and Prospectus to Regional Centres / B.Ed. Centres etc., and maintenance of related record and Register.

### Maintenance of MPDD Building:

- MPDD Building is well maintained through House Keeping and Security Services. Keeping the work place clean and hygienic has improved the efficiency of the employees.
- Pest control system is initiated to safeguard the Study Materials from bugs and insects, and as a result, damages that are caused by insects are totally controlled.
- Internet connectivity facilitates us to update the despatch information to Regional Centres as to other LRCs/Study Centre/CCs instantly.

### 5. Student Support Services Division [SSSD]

The Tamil Nadu Open University has students from different groups such as rural, urban, semi-urban, hill areas, physically challenged, jail inmates, personnel from government and non-government organisations, parents, home makers, house wives, women folk, industrial workers, socially and economically disadvantaged groups, schools wards, tribal, etc. The University has established its own eight Regional Centres, eight Constituent Community Colleges with its own faculties and 484 Learner Support Centres (consist of Learning Resource Centres, Programme Study Centres, Community Colleges, Jail Study Centres and Partner Institutions). All type of student support service activities are provided to TNOU learners' starting from pre admission counselling to term end examinations and award of Certification.

Monitoring of delivery mechanism has been carried out periodically by the faculties of Regional centres and feedback received from the Centre Coordinators, Academic Counsellors and Students are thoroughly discussed and action taken appropriately to strengthen the systems in TNOU

Like any other system of education, ODL also derives its strength from two-way communication. It is student support that makes this two-way communication possible between the teachers and the students and among the students themselves. Student Support Services (SSS) include all those activities that take place beyond the production and delivery of course materials.

Student Support Services System, which includes academics of Schools, Regional Centres, Learner Support Centres (LSCs)/Community Colleges/Other Centres provides SSS to its learners hailing from urban, rural and tribal areas; the physically challenged and inmates from rehabilitation houses, government and non government sectors, parents and homemakers, personnel of armed forces, the employers and the employed. The Tamil Nadu Open University has put special focus on women from minority communities, individuals from socially and economically disadvantaged groups and other tribal and low literacy areas of the Tamil Nadu.

### **REGIONAL CENTRES (RC)**

There are 13 Schools of Study which house the core faculties (Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor). These core faculties with the help of other experts develop the SLM and the entire academic oriented support. However, the sheer size of University in terms of student population and geographical area 'disconnects' most of its senior academic staff of Schools from involvement in to actual teaching/learning process. This responsibility basically lies with the Regional Centres (RC) which discharges such duties with the help of Coordinator, at the Regional Centres level and Coordinators and Academic Counsellors at the LSC/PSC/CC/LRC/PI level.

For proper provision, monitoring and supervision of SSS and learner progress, TNOU has been divided into Eight Regions to providing services to learners namely, Chennai, Madurai, Coimbatore, Dharmapuri, Trichy, Villupuram, Nilgiris and Tirunelveli. Each region has its territorial jurisdiction with Headquarters at central location and has responsibility to provide direct services to the learners as well as to monitor and supervise the learner and learning support services being rendered by the LSCs coming under its jurisdiction.

Hence it is the RC which ensures the smooth delivery of ODL programmes designed and developed by the Schools of Studies with the help of LSC. Besides ensuring flow of information it also ensures that the methodology of ODL is followed in letter and in spirit at the grassroots level while transacting the curriculum with the learners. Therefore, the Regional Centre is a very vital unit in TNOU to ensure that academic activities performed at the LSCs are as per the set principles of the ODL in general and TNOU in particular. However, it is the LSCs which, with the help of academic counsellors, ensure effective  $\zeta$  teaching learning transactions.

### 6. Cells/ Centres

### (i). Electronic Media Production and Research Centre (EMPRC)

The responsibility for the development and dissemination of academic content through electronic media rests with the Electronic Media Production and Research Centre (EMPRC). Initially, the Centre produced E-content audio and video programmes to supplement the SLMs (Self Learning Materials) of some of the academic programmes consisting of 63 courses of the University. Over a period of time, the EMPRC diversified its activities manifold including management of Smart Class rooms and video teleconferencing.

### (ii) TNOU University Library

TNOU operates a three-tier library system having main Library at the Headquarters and libraries at the Regional Centres and Learner Support Centres consists of Learning Resource Centres (LRCs), Programme Study Centres (PSCs) Community Colleges (CCs). TNOU Main library acts as the information hub of TNOU to provide access to books, journals, reports, thesis, Dissertations, Project Reports, TNOU Archives and other reference materials supplied by volunteers to TNOU. TNOU Main library was established in 2004 and was shifted to the TNOU Academic Block in 2015. It is spread over an area of 2500 sq.ft. TNOU Main library caters to the needs of academics, administrative and support staffs of TNOU in addition to the Research students and other students of TNOU.

Tamil Nadu Open University Library's mission is to make its resources available and useful to University members and to sustain and preserve the collection of knowledge and creativity of the Students and Research Scholars. Library is situated on the First Floor of Academic Block.

### Tamil Nadu Digital Library:

Creation of Networked Digital library of 13 Universities in Tamil Nadu:

The Hon'ble Former Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu had announced in Assembly, under the rule of 110 on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2014, for the creation of Networked Digital Library System for 13 Universities in Tamil Nadu. Tamil Nadu Open University jointly with Anna University has been involved in the creation of Networked Digital Library .Sanctioned grant for this project is Rupees One Crore Eighty six lakhs (Rs.1,86,00,000/-).

### Highlight of the Project:

Through Internet connectivity, the college students who study in affiliated colleges of these 13 Universities can also benefit through this system. This project will provide improved and equal access of high quality subject content at international level to the Students, Research Scholars and faculty members of all the colleges and Universities in Tamil Nadu.

### **Progress of the Project:**

The web page for the Tamil Nadu digital library is ready for the uploading the contents from the respective universities. The website link is **www.tndigitallibrary.ac.in** 

The member will be given a login account, using that they may view / download their resource.

### **Fund Sanctioned:**

The status report of the project concerning the creation of Networked Digital Library Systems in the 13 Universities in the State as per G.O.(Ms) No.226. dated: 27.12.2014.

At present, an amount of Rs.1,39,00,000/- has been sanctioned to meet the expenditures related to servers, storage system and manpower requirements for a period of one year. From the sanctioned amount, Rs.69,50,000/- was transferred to the Anna University and Tamil Nadu Open University Bank Account separately on 28<sup>th</sup> June 2016 by Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education. And the amount sanctioned to Tamil Nadu Open University has been deposited in Saving Bank a/c in the name of "Tamil Nadu Digital Library" in Indian Bank of Tamil Nadu Open University Branch.

The Server and other related accessories were purchased from the ELCOT for Rs.52,20,344/- (Rupees Fifty Two Lakhs, Twenty thousand Three Hundred and forty four only) on 21.06.2017, and the balance mount of Rs.17,29,656/- (Rupees Seventeen lakhs twenty nine thousand six Hundred and fifty six only) is retained in the aforementioned account for manpower.

The interview conducted by Anna University on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2017 for the selection of staff for the TNDL Project.

Library Professionals and Software professionals appointed for TNDL Project - Library Professionals (2 Nos), I.T. Professionals (2 Nos) and Web Designer/Programmer (1 No) joined duty from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2018, based on the interview conducted in Anna University.

### (iii) Centre for Smart Class Rooms with Video Conference

As per G.O.(Ms)No.38 Higher Education (K2) Department dated 26-03-2012 a Centre for Smart Class Rooms with Video Conference Facilities was established with an amount of Rs. 20 Lakhs. Smart Class Rooms with Video Conference Facilities is implemented at the 7<sup>th</sup> Floor of the Administrative Building of TNOU. So far 400 students have got benefited from the Smart Classrooms. Further the same is being extended to TNOU Regional Centres at Dharamapuri, Madurai, Trichy and Coimbatore by availing NIC Internet connectivity.

### (iv) Foreign Language Lab

As per G.O.(Ms)No.39 Higher Education (K2) Department dated 26-03-2012 a Foreign Language Laboratory has been established to teach Chinese, English, French and German and is functioning in the TNOU Second floor of the Administrative Building with an amount of Rs.15 Lakhs as funding from the State Government of Tamil Nadu. 450 students have got benefited. The lab will also be utilised by interested youth throughout the State of Tamil Nadu.



### (v) Entrepreneurship-cum-Skill Development Centre

As per G.O.(Ms)No.40 Higher Education (K2) Department dated 26-03-2012 Entrepreneurship-cum-Skill Development Centre has been established in the University, through which training was given to about 80 Community College Teachers with an amount of Rs. 20 Lakhs. Further, three months training programme have been imparted to 203 students in five centres in Tamil Nadu.

### (vi) Curriculum Development Cell

As per G.O.(Ms)No.42 Higher Education (K2) Department dated 26-03-2012 with an amount of Rs. 50 Lakhs, a Curriculum Development Cell was established in the University. As of now 390 Curricula were reformed and new Curricula have been framed for 20 Programmes.

As per the guidance and innovative ideas given by the Vice Chancellor of Tamil Nadu Open University the following Centres and Cells were established in TNOU and started functioning from April 2016.

(vii) Information Centre – The Information Centre was established and functioning at the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of TNOU with the aim of improving the Student Support Services by the following ways:

- Queries and grievances are received at Information Centre through a multi modal system viz., fax, post, in person, e-mails, SMS, Whatsapp and over phone are attended immediately.
- Post-admission enquiry and redressal of grievances of enrolled students regarding schedule of counselling/contact classes, conduct of practicals, submission of assignments; non-updation of marks, non-receipt of mark sheets/degrees, non- receipt of study materials and non-declaration of result attended every day.
- Prospects of Alumni and responding to queries by students and other stakeholders through post, email and phone.
- Support services were also provided in the form of handbook and prospectus and Pamphlets and personalized guidance
- Information Centre facilitates distribution of all kind of forms, information booklets and brochures to visitors and prospective students.
- Information Centre provides guidance for filling of various forms and tries to ensure the timely submission of requisite forms like admission, examination, credit transfers, re-registration, re-evaluation, change of name, change of address, award of degree, credit transfer and other academic transcripts from students.

(viii) Placement Cell and Student Welfare Cell at SSSD - Regional Centres have been organizing placement activities to help the desirous learners get jobs as per their qualification and aptitude. Regional placement drives for TNOU female graduating learners of TNOU were organised jointly with NGOs during the reporting period.

(ix) Academic Counselling Centre – The Academic Counselling Centre is being in operation at the first floor of the University with the prime objective of guiding the students who visit the University for

Selection of right Academic Programmes and to give knowledge to students about the vast number of options available in TNOU for continuation of their higher studies. The centre provides the following:

- Pre-admission enquiry and advice to potential learners in the form of guidance and counselling by the fulltime faculties of TNOU on rotation basis.
- Post programme enquiry for enhancing career and employment given by faculty members.

(x) Research Unit- Research Unit is the principal academic wing of TNOU that manages Research Degree Programmes of the University under the guidance of the Academic Council and Research Council. The Research Degree Programme of the University commenced in 2007, and 67 students were registered for M.Phil. / Ph.D. Programmes across various Disciplines during the period of the report.

In some of the Research Programmes, students are allowed to submit their theses in Tamil. A Research Policy has been enunciated to guide research activities in the University. The Research Unit has evolved Comprehensive Guidelines for inter-institutional cooperation under the scheme of Recognized Research Centres. Under the Tamil Nadu State Government Research Fellowship Scheme five Research Scholars were given Fellowship for Ph.D. Programme.

### (xi) Estate Unit

The Estate unit of the University maintains greenery of the University campus. The Estate unit has been engaged in plantation of trees, wide variety of flowers, ornamental plants, vegetables, development of lawns, and avenues to make the campus environment friendly. During the past few years, the Estate unit has focused on massive plantation of trees in the campus and Community Colleges as well as Regional Centres of TNOU and beautification of official buildings with indoor avenue plants. The patches of vacant places are landscaped and developed as beautiful lawns.

The Academic activities of Tamil Nadu Open University are mainly organised through the Schools of Studies. The Research activities, housed under various Schools of Studies are coordinated through a separate Directorate called 'Research Division'. This chapter provides information about Schools of Studies and new academic initiatives during the period of report. The externally funded research projects, seminars, workshops, lectures and training organised by Schools of Studies and Operating Divisions are provided separately. - 3. Organised the Leprosy Awareness Camp in collaboration Director of Public Health, Govt of Tamil Nadu, which was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister for Health & Welfare Dr. Vijayabhasker. The Hon'ble Minister has distributed the Walking Aids and Crutches to the beneficiaries.

- The School was actively engaged with linkage created between TNOU and the Entrepreneurship Development Innovation Institute (EDII) of the Government of Tamil Nadu and in designing of Certificate Programme in Entrepreneurship.

### 8. Future Activities Planned

- The School plans to start a New Programme namely Vocation Diploma in Machine Tools which will aim to bridge gap between the Education and the Industrial Skill requirement.
- Three number of short term Hands-on Training Programme for the small scale Women Entrepreneurs are to be conducted by the School
- The School is to utilize the resources of Sewing Machines available and provide a Skill Training Programme for the Women folk.
- The School plans to develop and publish Quarterly Newsletter of TNOU and the work regarding the same has been kick started.

### **School of Computer Science**

1. School of Computer Science has introduced Non-credit Certificate course in the area of skill development for School students. One of the Partner Institution, Land Mark Academy has enrolled and completed the first batch of 414 students for five programmes. Skill Training for School students of Tamil Nadu conducted by TNOU through Public Private Partnership (PPP) Mode. The University designed special Programs to the School students in consultation with subject experts for the purpose to gain knowledge in the IT Sector and Communication Skills.

The following programs are designed by the TNOU for giving Skill Training to School students starting from fifth to eleventh standard.

- i. Certificate in Basic Computer
- ii. Certificate in Office Automation
- iii. Certificate in Programming Techniques
- iv. Certificate in Multimedia Systems
- v. Certificate in Computer Applications

Tamil Nadu Open University, for the Non credit Certificate Programme the second batch of 2142 students were enrolled for five programmes of Basic Computer (517), Office Automation (427), Programming Techniques (370), Multimedia Systems (405) and Computer Applications (423) in April 2017 and completed the course in June 2017.

- 2. The MHRD has initiated the digitalization of Certificates through National Academic Depository (NAD) for the purpose of e-verification, online genuine verification, printing of certificates through online. The NAD identified two agencies for this process and instructed to sign Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with any one of the two agencies. The Tamil Nadu Open University has signed MoU with NSDL Database Management System (NDML) for digitalization process of all academic awards such as Certificates, Degrees, Diplomas, Mark sheets, etc.. The MoU between TNOU and NDML was signed on 18.08.2017 by the Registrar, TNOU and the authorities of the NDML.
  - As per the instruction of MHRD, a cell has been established at TNOU for NAD activities with the Nodal Officer Dr. R. Kalaiarasi, Assistant Professor, School of Computer Science. The Nodal Officer initiated the digitalization process of all academic awards such as Certificates, Degrees, Diplomas, Mark sheets, etc.
  - ii. The Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) has been invited for Nationwide awareness cum workshop on National Academic Depository (NAD) which was held on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at AICTE, New Delhi. Dr. R. Kalaiarasi, Nodal officer of NAD attended the workshop.

- iii. Digital Signature was purchased from e-mudhra during the month of November 2017. After purchasing the Digital Signatory certificate, TNOU has started the testing process with sample records of Degree Certificate. The testing process has been completed successfully and started to provide the original records of Degree Certificates.
- iv. More than 15,00,000 certificates including Degree/Diploma certificates, Provisional Certificates, Program Completion Certificates, Mark Statements and Consolidated Mark Statements for all the students who have written the Term End Examinations from 2003 to be digitalized and the digitalization process has been started with Degree/Diploma certificates under the guidelines of NDML and the completed documents shared with NDML immediately for further process.
- 3. TNOU has signed a MoU with INFLIBNET on 6 .11.2017 to upload the thesis in the Shodhganga repository.
- Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) in collaboration with Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL) is offering innovative degree programme called B.Sc. – Computer System Administration from Academic Year 2018 – 2019.
  - i. TNOU and MKCL have signed a MoU on 5.01.2018 to implement the B.Sc. Computer System Administration which is a work based learning programme. These Work-based Learning programmes are implemented in the real-life work environment of the industry. These programmes are in the form of eLearning supported Work Lab wherein the learners get an intensive exposure, expertise and experience practical skills under the guidance of mentor. It's an innovative learning through working paradigm through an attempt to seek a blend of the work environment and learning environment.
  - ii. B.Sc. Computer System Administration is the three year programme which is divided into six semesters. Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL) is a Public Limited Company promoted by the Department of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Maharashtra, India in 2001 to create new paradigm in education and development through universalization and integration of Information Technology in teaching, learning and educational management processes in particular and socio-economic transformative processes in general.
- Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between National Knowledge network (NKN) and Tamil Nadu Open University on 08.02.2018 for the purpose of using Internet connection with free of cost.

### **Students Profile**

The University follows two annual Academic cycles for its Academic Programmes, which are January to December and July to the following June. Regional Centres are the nodal points for admissions. In general, admissions to the academic Programmes are subject to the fulfilment of minimum eligibility criteria. However, for some specific academic Programmes, the admission is conducted through entrance test, such as Doctoral Programmes, Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) and Bachelor of Special Education (B.Ed-SE). With a view to providing better student services, the prospectus and application forms for admission to various academic Programmes are uploaded on the TNOU website, (www.tnou.ac.in). It includes information about admission and re-registration, list of Regional Centres and Learning Resource Centres (LRCs), Programme Learner Support Centres (PSCs) and Community Colleges of TNOU.

### **Student Services Centre at TNOU Headquarters**

During the period of the report, the University employed innovative strategies for enhancing enrolment across the State including Spot Admission in all the Regional Centres. All the TNOU Learning Resource Centres (LRCs), Programme Learner Study Centres (LSCs) and Community Colleges have helped in achieving a remarkable growth in learner enrolment during the reported period. TNOU is mandated to reach out to the marginalized sections of our society and special measures were initiated to attract learners from the disadvantaged groups. The profile of learners on the basis of gender, area of residence and social category(caste) is provided in the following graphs and tables.



#### 1. Gender-wise Distribution of Enrolment

Table -8.2 reflects that out of the total enrolment of 16,799 registered in 2017-18, of which 9457 students are females which constitute 56.29 % during the period of the report. The University has 386 jail inmates enrolled in different academic programmes. The gender wise distribution of students is graphically presented at Graph 8.1.

#### Table 8.2: Gender-wise Distribution of Enrolment




#### Graph Gender wise Distribution of Enrolment

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

Learners, who successfully complete the prescribed number of credits in a particular academic programme, are awarded Certificates/Diplomas/Degrees at the Convocation, usually held in November/December at the University Headquarters. Gold medals are awarded in all the academic programmes at Diploma and Degree levels to meritorious students during the Convocation.

The 10th Convocation was held in 28-11-2017 in which the Honorable Governor of Tamil Nadu, Thiru. Banwarilal Purohit presided over the Convocation and conferred the Degrees / Diplomas to 16,879 students of TNOU. Honorable Minister for Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu, Shri K.P. Anbalagan, felicitated the Convocation. The Convocation Address was delivered by the Chief Guest Dr. K. Alagusundaram, Deputy Director General (Engineering), Indian Council for Agricultural Research, Government of India, New Delhi which included CEMCA Cash Award of Rs. 25,000/-. In the 10th Convocation, a total of over 16,879 students from all over State of Tamil Nadu received Degrees / Diplomas and Certificates. In person Degree awarded is 1585. At the Headquarters, 209 students were awarded a Gold medal. #### SWAYAM (MOOCs Plat Form)

MHRD, Govt of India invited proposals from various institutions to offer programmes through online (MOOCs) under the SWAYAM MOOCs platform. IGNOU acts as a Nodal Agency for offering SWAYAM MOOCs through Open Universities. On 30.09.2016, a proposal containing 226 programmes proposed by the various Schools of TNOU was submitted to the National Coordinator SWAYAM MOOCs for the approval. 

This document provides a compendious account of the Strategic Action Plan the Vice-Chancellor has put in place since his assumption of Office in March 2016 with a view to ably addressing the mandate given to the Tamil Nadu Open University as reflected in the Act/Statutes and the Vision and Mission of the University.

### Vision

Tamil Nadu Open University shall make available innovative, socially-relevant educational provisions that are learner-centred, seamless and are of high-quality by employing appropriate technologies to achieve equity in education, sustainable social transformation and composite national development.

### Mission

Towards becoming a Centre of Excellence in Open and Distance Learning (ODL) by offering quality programs to meet the current and emerging needs of the adult population, by widening the access to higher education and by functioning as a catalyst to bridge social, including digital, divides and to build a developed India, Tamil Nadu Open University shall:

- Evolve flexible and robust curricula to widen educational access, deepen knowledge frontiers and create entrepreneurial skill sets.
- Reach the rural communities through lifelong learning programmes for livelihood improvement.
- Establish networked environments for quality assurance.
- Foster private-public partnerships.
- Bridge the digital divide and implement 'anywhere, anytime' learning environments.
- Become a digital repository for ODL in the State facilitating Research and Development for new knowledge creation.
- Coordinate and implement standards in ODL.

### **UGC Recognition**

TNOU was established in 2002, and the academic operations started in right earnest February 2003. The University has been enjoying institutional recognition since its inception from the UGC. Subsequently, it was accorded with the 12B status of the UGC. However, with the new ODL regime in place, the University under the leadership of the VC received Programme-wise recognition from the UGC for the years 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, a rare feat considering the fact only a few Open and Dual-mode Universities in India got this recognition. Furthermore, under norms of the ODL Regulations 2017, the University has successfully made an online submission to the UGC with a proposal for the recognition of 83 UG and PG Programmes from the Academic Year 2018-2019.

This is in reference to your proposal submitted for consideration of recognition in response to UGC letter F.No. 12-3/2016 (DEB-III) dated 21.03.2016 and subsequent interface meeting attended by your University/Institutions. In this regard, I am directed to inform that it has been decided to accord recognition to your institution to offer certain programmes through distance mode for two academic years i.e. 2016-17 and 2017-18 subject to strict adherence and compliance of the conditions mentioned in this letter.

2 The university shall scrupulously abide by the following terms and conditions, while offering the programmes through distance learning mode in accordance with the Affidavit dated 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2016 duly notarised and signed by Dr. S. Vijayan, Registrar, submitted to the Commission.

3 The recognition accorded to the institution will be valid only for the programmes/courses as mentioned in the list attached with this letter.

i) The University shall offer only those programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode, which are approved by the statutory bodies of the University as per norms and also by UGC and wherever necessary by the apex regulatory bodies in the country.

ii) It is the responsibility of the University to follow the norms prescribed by the concerned regulatory body/ics such as UGC, AICTE, NCTE/any other and also seek its/their prior approval, wherever required.

iii) The University shall not start any new programme without prior approval of UGC and other concerned regulatory authorities in anticipation of recognition.

iv) The nomenclature of all the programmes to be offered under distance mode shall be strictly as per UGC/AICTE Regulations.

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#### **Institutional Revamping and Rejuvenation**

The Student Support Service Division (SSSD) at the University is a Division established exclusively for providing learner services through a robust network of Learning Resource Centres (LRCs), Programme Learner Support Centres (PSCs), Community Colleges (CCs), Partner Institutions (PIs), etc. Initially, the responsibilities of these Centres though identical were looked after by the various executive arms of the University. Recognizing the duplication of work and unwieldy administrative set up, the

Vice-Chancellor has now brought these activities under a single command for better efficiency and quicker learner response.

- All types of Learner Support Centres , viz., LRC/PSC/CC/PI are brought under one administrative control of SSSD.
- 2. More supporting staff members were provided to the SSSD, and the Division was relocated to the First Floor of the University for ease of interaction with the learners.
- 3. Student Counselling Centres and Information Centres with ICT facilities, e.g., information kiosk, have been established for Student Welfare. The Information Desk at the Reception area of the University works from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm, except on Sundays.
- 4. Student Welfare and Placement Cell has been established to help the learner community in all possible ways for their education and employment and redressal of the grievances.
- 5. Promotional activities for student enrolment has been carried out through LRC/PSC/CC/PI.
- 6. Monitoring of LRC/PSC/CC has been carried out.
- 7. Periodical conduct of Coordinators' Meetings. Interactive sessions resulted in renewal of Centres, deletion of non-performing Centres, awareness creation programmes as per the ODL norms/UGC Guidelines.
- 8. Inspection for establishment of LRC/PSC/CC was made regular. Syndicate Sub-Committee has been formed to verify and check the Inspection Reports submitted by the Inspection Teams. For the first time, LOAs were signed between LRC/CC/PSC in TNOU and Orders were also issued with relevant details. Renewal fee/Recognition Fee/Deposit were collected to the tune of Rs. 1 Crore.
- 9. With a view to increasing the efficacy of the Regional Centres/ Community Colleges, Assistant Professors were transferred to each of the 8 Regional Centres. Besides, 10 posts of Assistant Professor-cum-Coordinators were established for posting them in the Regional Centres and Community Colleges.
- In all the Four Regional Centres, Computer Lab facilities were established and the setting of the Textile Lab is in progress. The lab facilities will be made available to extension activities of TNOU, e.g., giving training. Through this initiation, TNOU may also get revenue.
- 11. During the reporting period, 2 more Regional Centres, one each in Villupuram and Nilgiris with 50% funding from the Government, were established.
- 12. Under the GOI initiative 'Study Webs of Active Learning Young and Aspirant Minds' (SWAYAM) 8 Courses (SWAYAM-MOOCs) have been allotted to TNOU, for which the works are in progress. Expression of Interest Form along with 2 minute introductory video produced by the Faculty for each of the 8 Courses. These have also been uploaded in the SWAYAM/IGNOU portal. This was awarded to the University, and more are in line, after scrutinizing the University's capacity.
- 13. Non-Credit job-oriented Programmes were introduced in various Trades to equip the learners with the required skill sets.

### **Outreach Activities**

Outreach activities have been initiated at the TNOU, including the following:

- 1. Information banners with the details of all TNOU Academic Programmes were made and put at strategic places including at the venues at Namakkal and Vellore, where agricultural mela were conducted, which was appreciated by all the public and other educational institutions.
- 2. Pamphlets and leaflets about TNOU and its Academic Programmes were developed and were made available to the public.

### Student Registration and Evaluation Division (SR&ED)

With the technological advancements that permeate all spheres of work, it becomes necessary for the University to embark on efficient systems. Quite aware of this changing educational scenario, the VC took measures to introduce technology-enabled admission processes to ease the operational hurdles.

### Accordingly, the following new systems of operation were introduced:

- 1. Online system of admission has been introduced for the first time in TNOU through the portal <online.tnou.ac.in>
- 2. Online issuance of ID Cards to learners.
- 3. On time supply of learning materials.
- 4. Periodically monitoring of the SRED activities to improve the efficiency.
- 5. Posting of academic staff to the SRED to strengthen its learner support systems.
- 6. Strengthening of the Certificate Section and introduction of the concept of Chief Examiner for central evaluation.

### **Research Activities**

- 1. Approval obtained from the UGC for re-launch of Research Programmes, viz., M.Phil. & Ph.D. (Regular Mode).
- 2. In accordance with the UGC Guidelines 2016, the Regulations for the Research Programmes have been modified.
- 3. Representation was also made to the Government of Tamil Nadu seeking the issuance of a G.O. recognizing the Research Programmes of the University..

### Curriculum

- 1. In accordance with the ODL framework of the UGC with regard to learning materials, the University has revamped its entire curriculum and study Programmes.
- 2. The University is implementing the Common Syllabus Framework for the distance learning syllabus in the entire State as mandated by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
- 3. The Higher Education Department has recognized the University, as one among the 5 Universities that come under its purview, to implement the GOI initiative Ek Bharat Shresthta, Bharat.

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### Administration

Withdrawal of its Centres from outside Tamil Nadu in compliance with the UGC norms for territorial jurisdiction.

- 2. Introduction of Bio Metric attendance system.
- 3. Declaration of probation orders to the staff members. Since the inception of the University, this was not carried out. As a staff welfare measure the VC took up this matter by constituting a Committee and the probation was declared for all the eligible staff members on obtaining satisfactory remarks on their Annual Confidential Reports and other requisite documents.
- 4. Downsized the outsourced staff members by allotting a detailed work plan, and thereby ensuring reduction in University expenditure.
- 5. Since March 2016, i.e., on assuming office, the VC has held 28 Monthly Review Meetings, the reports of which were used to improve the entire system.
- 6. Faculty members have been sent to in house training at Coimbatore TNAU. Besides, seminars/ workshops were also conducted for the faculty members at the TNOU. Two Assistant Professors were deputed to IGNOU, New Delhi to learn about the preparation and implementation of programmes through MOOCs on the SWAYAM Portal.
- 7. For effective functioning, 3 posts of Directors were established and are engaged specifically for Academic, Research and Planning & Development.

### Awards

- 1. Received the Estrade Education Award, Mumbai, for innovations in ICT use in ODL in 2017.
- 2. Received the Abdul Kalam Knowledge Connectivity Award by OZONE, Trichy, for augmenting the future of education and skill development.

### Future Plan

- 1. Strengthening the digital interventions for improving the University administration, transparency and learning.
- 2. Obtaining NAAC Accreditation and NIRF Ranking to TNOU.

### **Establishment of Physical Fitness and Sports Club**

The consistent effort of our Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor the following indoor & outdoor games are becoming operational at the first time in the university campus under Physical Fitness and Sports Club:
